Deserts are defined as areas with an average annual precipitation of 250 millimetres (10 in) per year, (10 in) or as areas where more water is lost by evapotranspiration than precipitation. In the Köppen climate classification system, deserts are classified as BWh (hot or BWk (temperate desert). In the Thornthwaite climate classification system, deserts would be arid and megathermal climates (H0).
